19	1. HB 2 Appropriations
20	Detention Reimbursement Fund
21	Increase the County Detention Facilities Reimbursement Act fund to reimburse counties for
22	the cost of housing New Mexico Corrections Department (NMCD) inmates.
23	Currently the fund is \$5 million.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE CITY OF MORIARTY AND TORRANCE COUNTY FOR MUTUAL AID INVOLVING EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES, FIRE SUPPRESSION AND RESCUE ACTIVITIES

I. INTRODUCTION AND PURPOSE

The of purpose of this Mutual Aid Agreement (hereinafter referred to as "Agreement") is for the sharing of resources between the city of Moriarty, (hereinafter referred to as "City") and the County of Torrance, New Mexico, (hereinafter referred to as "County") to ensure the continuation of necessary emergency resources in the event the City or County requests aid to assist in its mitigation of an emergency event. Such a request may seek the use of another party's equipment, offices, meeting spaces, workspaces, employees, processes, consultation, and other services or property, or any combination of the above, and not limited to this list of possible resources. By way of a more specific example, and not limitation, the parties hereto may engage the other party for the provision of employees, equipment, or property for their fire protection, emergency medical services and rescue activities.

In furtherance of this purpose, the Agreement provides a framework through which the parties to this Agreement may assist one another in times of need. Each party to this Agreement recognizes that it may need to call upon another party to assist in its own need to provide ongoing services, to respond to catastrophes, emergencies, natural disasters, or the like. Each party further recognizes that non-emergency and emergency cooperation remains in the long-term interests of both, and therefore enters into this Agreement to ensure a consistent, coordinated, and timely response in providing mutual aid. By signing below, each Party agrees to be bound by all the terms contained herein.

II. PARTIES

This Agreement is made by and between the following parties, having an address and place of business as set forth below:

- a. The City of Moriarty, in the County of Torrance
 201 Broadway Blvd
 Moriarty, New Mexico 87035
- b. Torrance County, in the County of Torrance 205 S. Ninth Street Estancia, New Mexico 87016

III. LEGAL AUTHORITY

Pursuant to Section 59A-53-5 (C) NMSA 1978, the City and the County will consent by resolutions adopted by their respective governing bodies to the assistance and the boundaries of the other areas serviced. The parties shall adopt such resolutions no later than (90) calendar days after the acceptance of this Agreement.

IV. **DEFINITIONS**

a. "Assistance" shall mean all acts of assisting either City or County conducted for or on behalf of a requesting party, including but not limited to travel to and from the site of the emergency.

b. "Assisting Party" shall mean a party, either the City or County, which has determined to provide Assistance as set forth in Section V, below, and which actually provides Assistance to a requesting party. Employees of Assisting Party shall at all times during Assistance continue to be employees of Assisting party and shall not be deemed to be employees of requesting City of County for any purpose.

c. "Employees" shall mean of either party, personnel working and providing Assistance in the capacity as a volunteer or as a full-time FLSA covered emergency medical service provider or firefighter.

d. "Expenses" shall include:

i. The City and County covenant and agree that the cost of wages paid under then existing wage agreements, irrespective of whether the agreement is a collective bargaining agreement, personnel policy provision, individual labor agreement, or otherwise, are the responsibility of the respective employer and neither party shall request compensation for wages.

ii. The City and County covenant and agree that no claims for compensation will be made against each other for any loss, damage, personal injury or death occurring as a consequence of rendering Assistance under this Agreement and such rights and claims are hereby expressly waived.

V. REQUESTS FOR ASSISTANCE

Any party to this Agreement shall contact the regional dispatch center responsible for either party to request Assistance under this Agreement. Providing of any Assistance shall be subject to the availability of personnel and equipment at the sole discretion of the City Fire Chief and the County Fire Chief, respectively. See X. Limitations.

VI. SCOPE OF AGREEMENT

- a. The City will render mutual aid to Torrance County in the areas designated in Attachment A.
- b. The County will render mutual aid to the City of Moriarty in the areas designated in Attachment B.

VII. OBLIGATIONS OF REQUESTING PARTY

In connection with Assistance, the requesting party shall have the following obligations with regard to the Assisting Party:

- a. To provide its best estimate of the type and amount of equipment needed, the number and types of employees requested, and the estimated duration of the Assistance.
- b. To provide Assisting Party accurate Directions to where the Assisting Party employees will report for assignment and the name, title and telephone number of the representative of the requesting party that will direct employees of the Assisting Party.
- c. To provide a description of the requesting party's systems or operational plan, initiation of incident command system, applicable standard operating procedures, standing directives, and other useful information, as applicable.
- d. To release all employees of Assisting party once Assistance is no longer necessary or desirable.

VIII. OBILIGATIONS OF ASSISTING PARTY

In connection with Assistance, the Assisting Party shall have the following obligations with regarding to the requesting party:

- a. Comply with operational directives as provided by requesting party.
- b. Ensure compliance with safety policies including accountability for personnel and equipment.
- c. Communicate with on-scene incident command for any changes or modifications to personnel and/or equipment should the need arise.

IX. JOINT RESPONSIBILITIES

It shall be the responsibility of each party to do the following:

a. Identify potential hazards that could affect the City or the County and its personnel.

- b. Conduct joint planning, intelligence sharing and threat assessment development; and conduct a joint meeting and training at least biennially.
- c. Identify and inventory current services, equipment, supplies, personnel and other resources related to planning, prevention, mitigation, response and recovery activities; and
- d. Adopt and put into practice a jointly-agree standardized incident management system.

X. LIMITATIONS

The City and County will covenant and agree that either may withhold Assistance to the extent necessary to provide reasonable protection and services to its own jurisdiction. In the event during which Assistance is provided the Assisting Party's Employees shall continue to be under the command and control of the Assisting Party, to include standard operating procedures and medical protocols, but shall be under the requesting party's operational control. Assets and equipment of the Assisting Party shall remain under its ultimate control but shall be under the requesting party's operational control during the time of any response hereunder.

XI. TERM

This agreement shall continue in force and effect until such time as one of the parties withdraws its participation, upon no less than ten (10) days' written notice.

XII. APPLICABLE LAW

This Agreement is adopted under the laws of the State of New Mexico and shall be interpreted, governed by, and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of New Mexico, without regard to conflict of laws/rules of another state.

XIII. SEVERABILITY

All the provisions of this Agreement shall be considered as separate terms and conditions. In the event that any provision hereof is determined to be invalid, prohibited or unenforceable by a court or other body of competent jurisdiction, this Agreement shall be construed as if such invalid, prohibited or unenforceable provision had been more narrowly drawn so as not to be invalid, prohibited or unenforceable, the validity, legality and enforceability of the remaining provisions contained in this Agreement shall not in any way be affected or impaired thereby.

XIV. LIABILITY

Neither Party shall be liable for any claims, actions, demands, suits, or judgments arising from the other Party's performance under this Agreement or the performance of the other Party's agents, officers, or employees. Both Parties shall be liable only for claims, actions, demands, suits or

judgments arising from its own performance under this Agreement or the performances of its own agents, officers or employees.

XV. NEW MEXICO TORT CLAIMS ACT

Neither Party shall be responsible for liability incurred as a result of the other Party's acts or omissions in connection with this Agreement. Any liability incurred in connection with this Agreement is subject to the immunities and limitations of the New Mexico Tort Claims Act, NMSA 1978, Section 41-4-1, et seq., as amended. This Agreement is not intended to modify in any way the Parties' sovereign immunity under common or statutory law or any provisions of the New Mexico Tort Claims Act. The City and the County and their respective "public employees" as defined in the New Mexico Tort Claims Act do not waive sovereign immunity and do not waive any defense or limitation of liability pursuant to law.

XVI. ASSIGNMENT

Neither party may assign its interest in this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other party.

XVII. NO WAIVER

No failure to exercise, and no delay in exercising any right, power, or remedy hereunder any document delivered pursuant hereto shall impair any right, power, or remedy which the parties hereto may have, nor shall any such delay be construed to be a waiver of any such rights, powers, or remedies, or an acquiescence in any breach or default under this Agreement, not shall any waiver of any breach or default of any party hereunder be deemed a waiver of any default of breach subsequently occurring.

XVIII.NOTICE

Any required notice or other communication to be given hereunder shall be in writing and mailed, certified with return receipt requested, or emailed, or sent by such party at the address or number set forth below:

XIX. JOINT DRAFTING

The parties agree that this Agreement jointly drafted, and that they both had opportunity to negotiate terms and to obtain assistance of counsel in reviewing terms prior to execution. This Agreement shall be construed neither against nor in favor of wither party but shall be construed neither against nor in favor of either party but shall be construed in a neutral manner.

XX. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Agreement embodies the entire agreement and understanding between the parties relating to the subject matter hereof, and there are no covenants, promises, agreements, condition or understandings, oral or written, excepts as herein set forth.

XXI. RECORDING

The parties hereto agree that any party may record this Agreement in the land records of either the City or the County without further consent from the other party.

XXII. SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS

This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective successors and assigns.

XXIII. AGREEMENT AND COUNTERPARTS

This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, and each executed counterpart shall have the same force and effect as an original instrument and as if all parties to all the counterparts had signed the same instrument. Any signature page of this Agreement may be detached from any counterpart of the Agreement without impairing the legal effect of any signatures thereon and may be attached to another counterpart of this Agreement identical in form hereto but having attached it to one or more signature pages. By signing below, both the City and County agree and acknowledge that the foregoing terms and conditions shall apply to any request and rendering of Assistance as of the date written below. This Agreement supersedes and previous agreements.

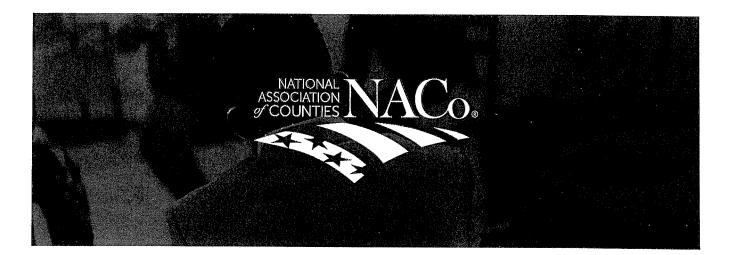

OVERVIEW

THIS AMENDMENT, hereinafter referred to as the "Amendment", is made and entered into by and between the Department of Finance and Administration, State of New Mexico, acting through the Local Government Division, Suite 202, Bataan Memorial Building, Santa Fe, New Mexico, 87501, hereinafter referred to as the "Division", and **Torrance County**, hereinafter referred to as the "Grantee", as of the date this Amendment is executed by the Division.

WHEREAS, on April 19, 2022 the DWI Grant Council awarded the Grantee \$95,000.00 to support programs to reduce the incidence of driving while intoxicated, alcoholism, and alcohol abuse in New Mexico ("Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Grantee and the Division entered into a grant agreement, effective July 1, 2022, in the amount of **\$95,000.00** to administer the Program ("Grant Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, on October 12, 2022, the DWI Grant Council awarded the Grantee \$6,473.66 of Fiscal Year 2022 reverted distribution funds to supplement the Grant Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Grantee and the Division desire to memorialize through this Amendment the terms and conditions upon which the additional funds will be made available to the Grantee.

AGREEMENT

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and obligations contained herein, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties hereby mutually agree to amend the Grant Agreement as follows:

- 1. Article IV Consideration and Method of Payment, Section A of the Grant Agreement is hereby amended to read in its entirety as follows:
 - A. "In consideration of the Grantee's satisfactory completion of all work and services required to be performed under the terms of this Grant Agreement, and in compliance with all other Grant Agreement requirements herein stated, the Division shall pay the Grantee a sum not to exceed <u>One Hundred One Thousand, Four Hundred Seventy-Three Dollars and Sixty-Six Cents (\$101,473.66)</u>. EXHIBIT "A"

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Name of Grantee: Torrance County Grant No.: 23-D-G-31 Grant Amount: \$101,473.66

Grantee will provide DWI program activities in the following areas:

1. <u>Prevention:</u>

Prevention is the active process that promotes the personal, physical and social well-being of individuals, families and communities to reinforce positive behaviors and healthy lifestyles. The term "prevention" is reserved for interventions that occur before the initial onset of a disorder. Prevention programs shall focus on the prevention of alcoholism, alcohol abuse, underage drinking, alcohol related domestic violence and DWI.

Prevention activities funded by LDWI will be shown to increase life skills and/or decrease risk factors that positively impact the rates of DWI and/or alcohol abuse. LDWI funds may be used to support the assessment, capacity, planning, implementation, and evaluation of such activities. Staff development (such as training required for certification) is an allowable prevention activity.

While funds for prevention can be budgeted in any allowable budget category, all funds spent on prevention should be in support of prevention activities identified and approved as part of a systematic planning process.

Prevention activities funded with LDWI grant funds should be either evidence-based or promising activities. DWI programs must be able to document compliance with this requirement.

2. Enforcement:

Overtime for officers to support sobriety checkpoints, directed patrols and underage drinking enforcement will be supported through the LDWI grant program.

3. Screening:

The grant **requires** a county-wide screening program that addresses all municipal, district and magistrate court referrals related to DWI. Other referrals addressing DWI-related issues may also be handled from schools and the probation and parole system. Programs must use the DFA-approved screening program.

The program **shall** use screening fees to self-fund the screening costs to the fullest extent possible. The fee structure shall include an appropriate sliding-fee schedule, based on earning capacity of offenders, to assist those offenders who are unable to pay the full fees.

The screening program shall not be provided by an alcoholism treatment program serving the judicial districts involved in order to avoid conflict of interest or screening bias. *See* NMSA 1978, § 43-3-11(D).

4. Treatment: Outpatient/Jail based

Treatment is an array of individual, family, group or social program or activity alternatives directed to intervene and address DWI, alcohol problems, alcohol dependence, alcoholism or alcohol abuse. Treatment seeks to reduce the consumption of alcohol, to support abstinence and recovery from drinking

alcohol, and to improve physical and emotional health, family and social relationships, well-being, and general quality of life.

The competitive grant and distribution funding supports outpatient treatment services and jail-based services that address alcohol abuse or alcohol dependence issues, as related to DWI and the prevention of repeated DWI offenses for offenders with current DWI convictions. Treatment providers can be contracted or on staff. Treatment providers must be licensed to practice in the State of New Mexico and must follow evidence-based treatment practices.

The treatment programs shall include a treatment assessment. This assessment shall be administered at admission and again at discharge for outpatient treatment. An individual treatment plan must be provided for each offender. The treatment program will address motivational, therapeutic, and psycho-educational approaches to assist the DWI offenders, and their family/collateral support system when feasible and appropriate, in (1) consideration for change of risk-taking behavior and (2) consideration for continued treatment and/or recovery maintenance.

The Children, Youth and Families Department (CYFD) has the statutory authority to oversee the Court Ordered Domestic Violence Offender Treatment and Intervention Programs (DVOTI). Any LDWI program funds used to supplement county DVOTI programs must adhere to the CYFD rule on DVOTI's, NMAC 8.8.7. DVOTI funded programs/personnel must participate in LDWI Planning Council meetings and coalition meetings.

5. <u>Compliance Monitoring/Tracking:</u>

The grant supports a compliance monitoring/tracking component, which strengthens tracking, follow-up, and supervised probation-type efforts with DWI offenders to assist courts in the monitoring for compliance of offenders with court-imposed sentencing (i.e., screening, treatment, ignition interlock, DWI School, etc.) Compliance monitoring follow-up may also include community service supervision. All programs must use the State selected screening and tracking instrument. Programs that fund supervised probation-type services must follow the Misdemeanor Compliance Program Guidelines issued by the Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC).

6. <u>Coordination, Planning, and Evaluation:</u>

The grant supports Coordination, Planning and Evaluation administered by a professional responsible for oversight of all LDWI program efforts: monitoring all activities; budgeting, planning and funding requests; development, maintenance and reporting of all reporting requirements; evaluation of the grant program progress and impact; submission of all required financial and program reports; staffing the LDWI Planning Council; attendance at DWI Grant Council meetings and at the LDWI Bureau workshops.

7. Alternative Sentencing:

Alternative sentencing provides the courts with sentencing alternatives to traditional incarceration, including electronic monitoring devices, alcohol monitoring devices, community custody, DWI Courts, and Alternative Adjudication programs (AJAP) including Teen Courts.

AJAP funding is limited to \$40,000 of LDWI funds. All AJAP's funded through the LDWI grant program must adhere to the Juvenile Adjudication Fund Guidelines, which can be found on the DFA website. All DWI courts must follow AOC specialty court guidelines
